RESOLUTION NO. 10-10

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE CREATION OF A BOWDLE, SD HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION.

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission (the "City"), as follows:

I. RECITALS, AUTHORIZATION AND FINDINGS.

- A. Recitals. Pursuant to Resolution No. 10-9 adopted by the Commission on July 5, 2010, a hearing was called to determine the need for a Housing and Redevelopment Commission to function in Bowdle, South Dakota. The City of Bowdle published the resolution and gave notice of a public hearing to consider this resolution in full conformity with the Laws of the State of South Dakota.
- B. Authorization. The City is authorized pursuant to SDCL 11-7-7 to create a Housing and Redevelopment Commission in the municipality, which Commission shall be a public body corporate and politic.
- C. Findings. The City of Bowdle finds that:
1. That there is a predominance of buildings that by reason of dilapidation, deterioration, age or obsolescence are injuriously to the entire City and are detrimental to the public health, safety, morals and welfare of the City.
  2. That because of the inadequate street layout, faulty lot layout in relation to size, adequacy, accessibility, usefulness, deterioration of site improvements, diversity of ownership, improper subdivision, obsolete platting, and non development of the area, there exists in the City areas

which prevent the development of adequate housing to meet the needs of the City.

3. That it is necessary and a proper public purpose to create a City of Bowdle Housing and Redevelopment Commission.

II. CREATION OF HOUSING AND REDEVLOPMENT COMMISSION.

A. Creation of Commission. There is hereby created in the City of Bowdle a body corporate and politic to be known as the "Bowdle SD Housing and Redevelopment Commission" (the "Commission").

B. Powers of Commission. The Commission shall have all powers expressly granted pursuant to SDCL 11-7 and 11-7A.

C. Composition of Commission. The Commission shall consist of five Commissioners.

1. Qualifications for Commissioner. All Commissioners shall be residents of the City of Bowdle, SD. No employees of the City may be on the Commission.

2. Appointment. All Commissioners shall be appointed by the mayor. Commissioners shall hold office until their successors have been appointed and qualified. A certificate of appointment of each Commissioner shall be filed with the clerk.

D. Meetings of Commission.

1. Regular Meetings. The Commission shall hold regular meetings at least semi-annually at the time and place to be established by the Commission

at its annual meeting, the first meeting to be held at the City Commission meeting room.

2. Annual Meeting. The Commission shall hold an annual meeting on the first \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_ of each year.

E. Codification of Commission. The City may hereafter pass an ordinance codifying the Commission.


